ARTICLE I

Name

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That the undersigned, all being citizens of the United States of America, have this day voluntarily associated themselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit Corporation in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 24.03 RCW, which Corporation will operate and conduct Heritage College as is now contemplated by said provisions, and do hereby make, subscribe and acknowledge, in triplicate, these Articles of Incorporation, in accordance with the provisions of RCW 24.03.010 to RCW 24.03.925, inclusive, do hereby formulate and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the Corporation is Heritage College.

ARTICLE II

Duration

The period of duration of the Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

Purpose

Section 1. The purposes and objects for which this Corporation is formed are:

- (a) The fostering and promotion of education, science, literature and the arts, and the promotion of research; the advancement and dissemination of knowledge; the promotion of secular and religious instruction; the care and education of youth, and of adults, in any of the branches of learning; the education of needy persons; and the promotion of works of mercy and charity.
- (b) To acquire, maintain and operate colleges and institutions of every character for educational, research and charitable purposes and at various locations within Washington State.
- (c) To grant such literary, collegiate, professional and academic honors or degrees as are usually granted by any university, college or seminary of learning in the United States, and especially honors and/or degrees in the arts, letters, sciences and music, and in testimony thereof to give suitable diplomas and certificates under the seal of the Corporation and the signatures of such officers of this Corporation and the institution as they deem expedient.

Section 2. The Corporation shall have no capital stock and no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any Director or officer of the Corporation or any private individual, except the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth above.

Section 3. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation except as may be permitted to Section 501(c)(3) organizations by the Internal Revenue Code, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code as now stated, or as it may be hereafter amended, or by organizations, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such Code as now stated, or as it may be hereafter amended.

SECTION IV

Dissolution

Section 1. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall adopt a resolution of the Board of Directors dissolving the non-profit Corporation, which may be either at an annual or a special meeting, and in accordance with the requirements of RCW 24.03.220. The recommended plan of distribution shall be as follows:

(a) All liabilities and obligations of the Corporation shall be paid and discharged, or adequate provision shall be made therefor;

- (b) Assets held by the Corporation upon condition requiring a return, transfer or conveyance, which condition occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements;
- (c) Assets received and held by the Corporation subject to limitations permitting their use only for education or similar purposes, but not held upon a condition requiring a return, transfer or conveyance by reason of the dissolution, shall be transferred or conveyed to one or more domestic or foreign corporations, societies or organizations engaged in activities substantially similar to those of the distribution adopted;
- (d) The domestic or foreign corporations, or societies or organizations to whom the assets will be distributed under the preceding Paragraph (c) of this Section 1, shall be such as are organized exclusively for educational or similar purposes as shall, at the same time, qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law;
- (f) Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of the County in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said court shall

determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Section 2. Any such plan of distribution shall be adopted by receiving at least a majority of votes of the Directors in office.

ARTICLE V

Powers

Section 1. In general, and subject to such limitations and conditions as are or may be prescribed by law, or in the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall have all powers which now or are hereafter conferred by law upon a corporation organized for the purposes hereinabove set forth, or necessary or incidental to the powers so confirmed, or conducive to the attainment of the purposes of the Corporation.

The specific powers of the Corporation shall be:

- (a) To acquire, mortgage and sell, to receive and to hold by purchase, gift, devise, bequest or grant, property, personal and real, for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Corporation, and to make Bylaws, rules and regulations as may be deemed proper and best for the welfare and good order of the Corporation;
- (b) To acquire, take over, continue, maintain, operate and conduct Heritage College, which was formerly known as satellite programs of Fort Wright College of the Holy Names, heretofore owned and operated by Fort Wright College of the Holy Names, Inc., a Washington corporation;

- (c) To accept and receive assignments and conveyances from said Fort Wright College of the Holy Names, Inc., a Washington corporation, of the title of all of its property, rights, franchises, licenses, permits, so far as it is necessary that Heritage College, formerly known as satellite programs of Fort Wright College of the Holy Names, may continue to be conducted and operated without interruption; and
- (d) To acquire, take over, continue, maintain, operate and conduct such other colleges and institutions of every character or educational, research and charitable purposes at such other locations within the State of Washington as the Directors shall deem proper and best for the welfare and the good order of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI

Membership

The Corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE VII

Registered Office and Registered Agent

The address of the initial registered office of the Corporation shall be Smartlowit Education Center, Linden Street, City of Toppenish, County of Yakima, Washington. The name of the initial registered agent of the Corporation at such address shall be Sister Kathleen Ross.

ARTICLE VIII

Directors

The number of Directors constituting the initial Board

of Directors the Corporation shall be nine (9) Directors.

Based on information supplied, and assuming your operations will be as stated in your application for recognition of exemption, we have determined you are exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

We have further determined that you are not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code, because you are an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(i1).
