Policy

Academic freedom is central to Heritage University's (HU) mission that "empowers a multi- cultural and inclusive student body to overcome the social, cultural, economic and geographic barriers that limit access to higher education. Rooted in the homeland of the Yakama Nation, we embrace transformational student-centered education that cultivates leadership and a commitment to the promotion of a more just society." https://www.heritage.edu/about-heritage-university/our-mission/

Academic freedom is a long-standing philosophical and legal principle in higher education, and it is essential to shared governance. Faculty members are protected in their freedom to teach and conduct and publish scholarly research, subject to the academic judgment of their peers.

"Academic freedom is the freedom of a teacher or researcher in higher education to investigate and discuss the issues in his or her academic field, and to teach or publish findings without interference from political figures, boards of trustees, donors, or other entities. Academic freedom also protects the right of a faculty member to speak freely when participating in institutional governance, as well as to speak freely as a citizen."
